Well, the good news is that a lot of people have put their hand up and reinstated their advertising in the Pinkie and for this we are very grateful.

What it means is that along with the discounted price from our printer the Pinkie is back to being able to break even again.

We did apply for a grant but were knocked back on the basis that nobody was getting grants, only loans and that was after having been passed through four different government and non-government bodies, one of which was happy to offer an interest free loan of \$10,000, repayable within 12 months. The trouble with loans is you have to pay them back and committing to repay that amount of money was too much for an enterprise as small as this.

We do have one possibility left and that would be a further wage subsidy. For that, as a small company with one to three employees, you need to prove that your income has been reduced by over 40% as a result of the lockdown and The Pinkie income reduced by about 90%. So fingers crossed we can access that and that will give us the breathing room to operate until the economy hopefully picks up.


We are particularly grateful to those advertisers who are back in the Pinkie and would sincerely ask that you spend locally and patronise those people who are helping us to continue to operate.

Needless to say we cannot operate forever on a break even basis, but as things stand we are hopeful that we can last another 90 odd years - the paper was established in the 1930s -

## Kylie Kwong's chicken, chilli and Hokkien noodle soup

You can use any type of noodles in this soup, including fresh rice noodles, thin egg noodles and Shanghai noodles. If you are using vacuum-packed, pre-cooked noodles, rinse them under hot running water to untangle them and drain before adding to the soup. I prefer to use fresh Hokkien noodles, available at Asian grocers. Prepare them as you would fresh pasta, blanching them in a pot of boiling salted water and draining before adding to your soup.

### Ingredients

½ bunch (about 200g) bok choy  
450g pre-cooked Hokkien noodles  
6 cups rich Chinese chicken stock  
3 tbsp light soy sauce  
1 tbsp ginger, cut into matchsticks  
1 tsp white sugar  
400g free-range chicken thigh fillet, cut widthways into 1cm slices  
1 tsp sesame oil  
½ cup spring onions, cut into matchsticks  
2 large red chillies, finely sliced on the diagonal

### Method

1. Remove cores from bok choy, cut crossways into four, then wash thoroughly and drain.
2. Place noodles in a colander and rinse well under hot running water, then drain.
3. Bring stock to the boil in a large heavy-based pot. Add soy sauce, ginger and sugar and stir to combine.
4. Reduce heat, add drained noodles, and simmer gently for 30 seconds. Add bok choy and chicken and simmer for a further two minutes or until chicken is cooked through. Stir in sesame oil, then remove pot from stove.
5. Ladle soup into large bowls. Place spring onion and chilli in a separate bowl and serve alongside the soup.



## Garlic, sweet potato and chickpea soup

A super comforting, ward-away-the-blues autumn soup with a rich sweet flavour that's offset by a squeeze of lemon and a few twists of ground black pepper added straight onto each person's soup bowl at the table.

### Ingredients

8 big cloves garlic, peeled and sliced  
1 onion, peeled and chopped  
30g olive oil  
350g cooked sweet potato  
400g can chickpeas, drained  
1 tsp salt  
2 tsp dried thyme  
2 tsp ground turmeric, or 3cm piece of fresh turmeric, peeled and grated  
½ tsp ground cayenne pepper  
lemon juice, to finish

### Method

1. Put the garlic, onions and olive oil in a large saucepan with a splash of water: this creates extra steam to soften the garlic quickly. Bring to the boil then reduce the heat and cook for 5 minutes until the water has evaporated and garlic is very soft.
2. Add the sweet potato, chickpeas, salt, thyme, turmeric, cayenne and 800ml water, then bring to the boil, cooking until the sweet potato has softened further. Remove from the heat and leave to cool slightly.
3. Puree mixture in a blender until smooth. Return to the pan, adjust the consistency with extra water if needed, then heat until boiling. Divide among 4 to 6 bowls and add a drizzle of lemon juice and a couple of grinds of black pepper to each bowl. Serve with red onion and cheese scones.

# Cauliflower and Cheese Soup

For this old favourite I leave some bits of cauliflower whole and chunky and puree the rest into something velvety and luscious. It's so easy to put together and the flavours are clean and light. If you want to go even lighter, omit the cream. It's not totally necessary but rounds everything out beautifully.

## Ingredients

- 50g butter
- 1 medium onion, diced
- 550g cauliflower florets, thinly sliced, plus 250g extra florets, left in big pieces
- 850ml chicken or vegetable stock
- 3 sprigs thyme
- 1 bay leaf
- 100ml cream (optional)
- 120g grated cheddar or other good melting cheese (even Blue if you really like it)

## Method

1. Place a large pot on the stove over medium heat. Add the butter and then the onions and sweat them down with a pinch of salt for five minutes. You don't want the onions to colour so reduce the heat further if you need to.
2. Add the thinly sliced cauliflower with a bit more salt and saute that with the onions for another 10 minutes on low heat. Give it an occasional stir to make sure it's not browning.
3. Add the stock, thyme and bay leaf and bring to a simmer. Now add the large pieces of cauliflower and allow to simmer for 10 to 15 more minutes, or until the large pieces of cauliflower are tender. When everything is cooked, remove and discard the thyme and bay leaf, and pull out the large pieces of cauliflower and set them aside. Add the cream, if using, to the soup and blend to a smooth puree. Adjust seasoning and consistency with salt and splash of water if you prefer a thinner soup.
4. Chop the large pieces of cauliflower roughly and recombine with the pureed soup. Bring everything back to a simmer.
5. To serve, distribute among four bowls, adding 30g of grated cheese to the top of each bowl. Crack a bit of pepper over that and add a drizzle of good extra virgin olive oil. Serve immediately.

# Lamb shank and barley soup with lots of vegies

Try to get some large hindquarter shanks, perfect for this soup.

## Ingredients

- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 2 large meaty lamb shanks
- 50g butter
- 2 large onions, finely sliced
- 2 large cloves garlic, sliced
- 4 medium carrots, halved lengthways and sliced
- 1 leek, halved lengthways and sliced
- 2 sticks celery, sliced
- 1 parsnip, peeled, cut in half lengthways and thinly sliced
- Sprig thyme
- 2 large waxy potatoes, peeled and diced
- 2 litres water
- ½ cup pearl barley
- Fresh bayleaf
- Sea salt and freshly ground pepper
- 1 cup fresh parsley sprigs

## Method

Heat oil in a large heavy-based pot. Brown shanks on all sides, remove from pot and set aside. Melt butter, then add onions, garlic, carrots, leek, celery, parsnip and thyme. Cook over low heat for 15 minutes until softened. Add potatoes and cook for five minutes. Add water, pearl barley, shanks and bay leaf. Bring to the boil, then reduce heat and simmer for 60 minutes, until shanks are tender and meat is falling off the bone. Remove shanks and shred meat with your fingers or a fork. Discard bones. Return lamb to the pot. Season with salt and pepper, add chopped parsley and serve.



# Back Country Characters

## Ned James

### Master Builder in Cob

Ned James came to Nelson as a young man in 1842, having been a bosun on a whaling ship. He went on to be at various times a ships' builder/carpenter, blacksmith, house builder, station hand and rope maker. He became the master builder of cob buildings.

An old saying went that a cob house must have a good hat and dry feet. The stone foundation was the dry feet and the snow tussock thatched roof the good hat.

From the 1860s when the country out behind Hanmer Springs was emerging from being terra incognita into farmed land and stock routes from one province to the other it was necessary to build structures from the materials that were available. This was where Ned James came into his own and for two decades he was very much in demand to build cob cottages.

The high quality of his construction work is evidenced by the fact that these buildings still stand in original condition some one hundred and fifty years later. He built the first Molesworth 'homestead', a one roomed dwelling built in 1866 at the behest of runholder John Cornelius Murphy and this was extended some twenty years later for Murphy's successor, William Atkinson.

Murphy was the first run holder to ever winter over at Molesworth, which he did in James's original cob cottage. He later described it as "a sort of esquimaux's life. We were shut up sometimes four or five weeks.

The second homestead was a two room cottage each room with a separate doorway to a low verandah. On most of James's buildings the original tussock thatch roofs have long since given way to corrugated iron.

In 1862 the Nelson government gave runholder Thomas Grant of St Helens a grant of £ 300 cash and the grazing rights for 'an house of accommodation in the Acheron Valley to be set strategically on a terrace at the junction of the Acheron and Clarence Rivers. Six others were built between Tophouse at the head of the Wairau Valley and Hasties just south of the Hurunui River.

When Ned James built the Acheron in 1863 he did so from materials available around the site, cob for the



walls and thatched tussock for the roof. Some of the guests were very rough diamonds and if only walls could talk there would be many tales to tell. The house also served as an out station for the St Helens run. The building has since been reroofed with iron and the Department of Conservation and Heritage New Zealand volunteers have done subsequent conservation work.

Your writer remembers visiting the building in the 1950s and of great fascination was the fact that all the interior walls were papered with the glossy photo pages that appeared in the centre of the Auckland Weekly from 1861 onward. Sadly, in one of the conservation efforts somebody saw fit to remove the majority of these and although there are some left the majority have gone, as they have from Fowlers Hut further up the Clarence Valley..

James also built the original homesteads at the Rainbow and Tarnedale and Manuka Island and he also constructed many cob whares in the Wairau Valley. He did not use boxing in the making of his cob walls. The walls were trimmed and plastered after they had dried.

The first step in the construction of a cob structure was to dig a trench the size of the building. This was filled with stones and became the dry foundation on which the cob walls sat. The walls were then constructed by working around the entire perimeter, increasing the height by about a foot (30cm) a day. The whole wall couldn't be built in one go as the cob shrank as it dried..

The cob mixture for the Acheron accommodation house was made from local clay, tussock, animal dung and water. The beams which supported the tussock thatch roof were of black beech and these were cut from beech trees in Bush Gully.

When the building was completed and walls completely trimmed the whole building was then lime washed to further protect it from the weather.


