We also have the opportunity to learn those things we didn't expect we would achieve, but did. For example, those with children at home learned to cherish the work of school teachers. It was ordered in March and along with 50 torn surgical masks arrived yesterday.

Subsidised Internet Reduces “Digital Divide”

Subsidised internet, in the form of a programme called Skinny Jump, is now cheaper and more widely available to those who may struggle getting online.

The Spark Foundation and Skinny have announced reduced rates for using Skinny Jump modems, their popular subsidised wireless internet connection. The scheme is accessible in the Hurunui district through the area's libraries.

Rates are now \$5 for 30 Gigabytes, a quarter of the price of the cheapest commercial services available. The new rates will apply to existing Jump users and eligibility to obtain a Skinny Jump modem has been widely extended.

As well as being available for families with children, Skinny Jump can be obtained by people identifying with one or more of the following groups: people with disabilities, migrants and refugees with English as a second language, Māori & Pasifika youth, offenders and ex-offenders, seniors, and people living in social housing.

Jump is a flexible pre-pay internet service. Because it uses Skinny's 4G wireless network there's no fibre or landline connection and no installation cost. No credit references or credit checks are needed, and as a pre-pay service, there are no term contracts. Users are limited to five top-ups each month (a maximum of 150GB per month), so Jump is not suitable for everyone. People who want to play online games or watch lots of movies should check out a fixed line internet option.

The Hurunui District Library in Amberley, as a Jump partner, can help eligible people signup for this service. Residents can call the library on 03 314 8980 to find out if they are eligible.

Hurunui Librarian Susie MacKenzie will then check to make sure the household is in a Skinny coverage area and complete an application form on their behalf. Once details are submitted, a modem and setup guide will be couriered directly to the applicants.

“This is a great opportunity for people to get connected to the internet, so they can access information and keep in touch with friends and family,” MacKenzie said.

“The internet plays such a large role in our lives these days. Skinny Jump is a vital government initiative, helping to reduce the digital divide and make broadband more accessible.”

One-pan chicken curry rice

Ingredients

1.5-1.7kg whole chicken, cut into 6-8 pieces (or use 6 bone-in chicken thighs)
salt
2 tbsp olive oil
200g sliced onion (about 1 large onion)
1 tbsp Keen's curry powder or your preferred blend (check gluten-free if required)
200g well-rinsed jasmine rice*
400ml chicken stock
400g cauliflower florets

To serve

yoghurt
lemon wedges
fresh coriander

Method

1. Season the chicken pieces with salt, then heat a large skillet on high. When quite hot, add the olive oil and place the chicken, skin side down, in the pan. Do not touch the chicken for a full 10 minutes. Then, remove the chicken from the pan, set aside on a plate and sauté the onions in the drippings for three minutes. Add a teaspoon of salt to the onions while they cook.
2. Add the curry powder and sizzle that for a few seconds. Next, add the rice and stir to coat in the oil. Nestle the chicken in the rice, skin side up this time, and add the chicken stock. Season the whole pan with one teaspoon of salt.
3. Bring the pan to a rapid boil and then place a well-fitting lid on the pan, turn the heat down to very low and do not touch the pan for 13 minutes. After 13 minutes, lift the lid and toss the cauliflower florets into the pan quickly and then place the lid back on.
4. Continue cooking for another seven minutes, then turn the heat off and allow the pan to sit, still covered, for five minutes. Then, uncover and serve immediately with a dollop of yoghurt, a wedge of lemon, a sprinkle of salt and pepper and fresh coriander leaves to garnish.

Salmon with coconut milk, glass noodles and herbs recipe

This brilliant one-pot dish really couldn't get any easier. Just throw everything in together and it's all done in a matter of minutes.

Ingredients

400ml can coconut milk
2 tbsp fish sauce
2 tsp sugar
juice of 1 lime
1 small brown onion, finely sliced
3 garlic cloves, crushed
1 large red chilli, sliced
4 small salmon fillets (around 150g each), skin removed
200g dried mung bean vermicelli (glass noodles)
½ cup each of loosely packed basil, mint and coriander

Method

1. Place the coconut milk, fish sauce, sugar, lime juice, onion, garlic and chilli in a lidded frying pan and bring to a simmer with a ½ cup of water.
2. Add the salmon fillets and reduce the heat to low. Cover with the lid and poach for five minutes.
3. Add the glass noodles around the salmon and replace the cover to allow the noodles to absorb the liquid. Cook for a further five minutes.
4. Stir through most of the herbs and serve immediately with the remaining herbs scattered on top.





Chicken Veloute

This "composed" stew isn't just a jumble of ingredients cooked together. Instead, each vegetable is added separately so they lightly poach in the rich, thick sauce and retain their texture.

Ingredients

4 chicken wings
100g butter
4 chicken thighs
2 cups button mushrooms, halved
4 thick rashers bacon, cut into lardons
1 brown onion, sliced
½ cup flour
½ cup white wine
1½ litres chicken stock
2 bay leaves
4 sprigs thyme
½ small savoy cabbage, divided into two wedges
3 carrots, peeled and cut into thirds
½ head broccoli, separated into florets
a handful of green beans, tailed
100ml pouring cream

Method

1. Joint the chicken wings and put the wing tips to one side – they're not needed in this dish. Heat a little of the butter in a large, wide, heavy-lidded saucepan. Fry the chicken thighs and wings until well browned on the outside but not yet cooked through. Remove from the pan and set aside.
2. In the same pan, fry the mushrooms until well browned, remove from the pan and set aside. Add the bacon and fry until browned, then add the onion and remaining butter and cook until the onions soften. Add the flour and cook, stirring, for 3 minutes until a roux forms. Add the wine and chicken stock a little at a time, stirring constantly to remove any lumps from the roux until you have a thick sauce. Season to taste with salt and white pepper. Add the bay leaves, thyme, cabbage wedges and carrots, reduce the heat to a simmer, then cover and cook for 20 minutes.
3. Slice the chicken thighs and add with the wings to one section of the pot. Add the mushrooms to another section. Simmer for 5 minutes, then add the broccoli and beans in their own sections. Simmer for a further minute, then taste and adjust for seasoning again (it will likely need a little more salt). Pour the cream over the stew and serve.

Warm chickpea and rice one-pot wonder with yoghurt and greens

I used chicken stock for this number as it was all I had at the time, that emergency store-bought stuff stashed in the back of the cupboard, no less. To keep this vegetarian simply substitute with vegetable stock and to make vegan swap the Greek yoghurt with coconut yoghurt.

Ingredients

1 tbsp olive oil
1 small brown onion, finely chopped
2 tsp turmeric
2 tsp chilli flakes
2 tsp cumin (seeds or ground)
2 cups cooked rice
400g can chickpeas, rinsed and drained
1½ cups stock (I used chicken)
6-10 stems Tuscan kale (cavolo nero), trimmed and torn
juice and zest of 1 lemon
1 cup chopped mixed herbs (whatever is available; I used coriander and flat-leaf parsley)
1-2 tbsp sultanas (optional)
½ cup thick Greek-style yoghurt

Method

1. Place a frypan over medium heat. Add the olive oil and once shimmering add the onion and cook until translucent. Add the spices and cook for 30 seconds or until fragrant and the onion is coated. Add the rice and chickpeas, stirring constantly.
2. Add the stock then reduce heat and simmer for 15 minutes or until completely warmed through and most of the stock has absorbed.
3. Push the torn kale leaves into the frypan to soften with the heat of the stew. Add the lemon juice and zest and cook for another minute. Remove from heat and scatter over herbs and sultanas, if using. Dollop with yoghurt and serve.





Mary Holloway Standing For West Ward Seat

Mary Holloway, the current Chair of the Community Board has nominated for the Council's West Ward seat vacated by Jason Fletcher.

At the time of writing Mary's was the only nomination but the final date for people to put their name forward will be this Thursday, 18th June. Should there be no other

nominations Mary will be automatically elected to the seat. Should somebody else put their name forward it will necessitate an election.

Mary told the Pinkie how critical she thought it was for somebody from Hanmer Springs to be on the Council representing our village's interests. With the rearrangement of the wards in the Council, Hanmer has lost its dedicated seat and instead become a part of the West Ward which already has three Councillors from the Rotherham and Waiau areas but with the resignation of Jason Fletcher, nobody local is representing Hanmer Springs.

Jason has in fact been one of Mary's nominators.

After a term on the Community Board plus a further half a term as its Chair, Mary is suitably qualified to make sure that Hanmer's voice is heard loud and clear in Amberley.

She told us she feels that it is imperative that progress should reflect the values and desires of this community.

Complication of Local Body Politics

Should Mary be elected unopposed then she will step aside from the Chair of the Community Board, but as the Councillor would retain a place on the Board.

Because of Jason Fletcher's resignation there would then be a vacancy on the Community Board and this would mean a by-election for that seat. Nominations would be called for from residents and/or ratepayers of Hanmer Springs.

Should somebody stand against Mary for the Councillor seat then a postal ballot election would be necessary at a cost of around \$30,000. Should she be unopposed then the cost of her appointment would be around \$3000.

With the seat on the Community Board, if only one person stands, that person would be elected unopposed.

Should there be more than one person, then a postal ballot will be necessary, at a cost of between \$12,000 and \$15,000.

Should nobody stand the Board would have the option of appointing a new member.

The matter of who assumes the Chair of the Community Board would be decided among the serving Board members.

Hanmer Loses Two Loyal Friends

It is with sadness that we record the passing of two of Hanmer's old identities and stalwarts of the golf club. Ernie Poole was a long time friend to golf in Hanmer and the rest of Canterbury. He owned a house in Jollies Pass Road and was widely regarded as an "encyclopedia of golf knowledge" with an excellent understanding of the rules of golf, course rating, handicapping and the like. In terms of New Zealand Golf he made major contributions to the CGRA, Course Rating, and in recent times statistical analysis of golf club membership trends and issues.

He was the person to whom the golf club here turned, to answer any question on the subject of not only golf, but also the ins and outs of running a club in New Zealand. He was 87. In cooperation with Richard Tapper he wrote the book '100 Years of Golf. A History of the Hanmer Springs Golf Club'. He was an old boy of St Andrews having been their Head Prefect in 1950 and was former teacher and Headmaster of various high schools, among them Riccarton High.



The other familiar face who is missing is that of Dr Richard (Dick) Carter who owned a house in Hanmer for many years and who was a familiar figure at the golf club here. He will be especially remembered for his laugh, his wonderful sense of humour and the ever present pipe. He was 91 and was predeceased by only a few months by his much loved wife, Janet. He was a life long friend of the late Hugh Burry. He was known as the old fashioned type of GP and family doctor who served a family with house calls and everything medical, including delivering their children.


