Dear Pinkie,

Re Tree Planting River Road

The council has responded to my letter regarding the River Rd sewerage treatment block. It appears their justification in choosing to plant pine trees rather than natives is that in 2014/15, research had only been done on radiata nutrient uptake, not natives.

They should reconsider as available science may have changed since then.

Pines are shallow-rooted and therefore not as well-suited to the job of preventing sewerage leaching down towards the Hanmer River as deep-rooted natives would be,

The tendency of pines to topple in high winds, and the necessity of felling them every 15 years means costs would be much higher than a one-off planting of natives, due to damage done to fences and irrigation posts, and replanting costs. The qualified ecologist who has offered his services free-of-charge to design a nutrient plan for planting natives, recommends flax be planted around the irrigation posts where the ground is wettest, with native trees in between.

Where is the consultation with Iwi? It seems unlikely they would forego the opportunity to create a native area, which would act as a breeding ground for native birds, in favour of pines. It cannot be passed-up on the whim of the council who have provided no real justification in their response other than the cost benefits of planting pines, when obviously they will be more expensive if felling, replanting, and replacement of fences and posts is factored-in

Open letter from MainPower to Hanmer Springs customers impacted by the electricity outage on 12 August 2020

On behalf of MainPower, I would like to apologise for the impact the unplanned electricity outage on 12 August had on some Hanmer Springs residents. It was never our intention for Hanmer Springs to go without electricity for this duration. As communicated prior, we had critical network maintenance we needed to complete to allow us to address possible failure points of electricity supply to the region. This had been scheduled for earlier in the year however the impact of Covid-19 resulted in us having to delay.

We sought feedback from customers in the Culverden, Mouse Point and Hanmer Springs areas as well as electricity retailers and Fonterra (on behalf of dairy farmers in the region), and looked into a number of options, including:

* Moving the outage to later in the year. This was not deemed feasible as the irrigation load on the network is too high to be managed with generation.

* Moving the outage to next year. This was not feasible due to the criticality of the work needing to be completed.

* Increasing generation to enable the work to be carried out with minimal disruption to customers. This was the preferred option and was in line with the feedback we had received from customers and industry representatives. The lower load on the network at this time of year made generation feasible compared with other times of the year.

MainPower engaged an experienced subcontractor to provide generation to cover the scheduled maintenance from 11-13 August 2020. This obviously came at a substantial cost to MainPower, however we believed this was acceptable as we wanted to lessen any impact on our customers. We used a reputable subcontractor who we have worked in the past and is a global player in the generation services market. The subcontractor was responsible for the generation for the full works period. Four generators were supplied to ensure there was more than enough electricity to manage the load of Hanmer Springs at this time of year and allow us to carry out our work safely. These four generators were connected to two of their transformers to allow all of Hanmer Springs to be supplied with electricity.

Unfortunately, one of the transformers experienced a major failure that could not be fixed, this meant two of the generators could not operate. The remaining two generators and transformer were not able to supply enough electricity for all of Hanmer Springs, this is why electricity was only able to be restored to parts of the central business area. We searched for another transformer all over Canterbury including asking other lines companies in the South Island, however we were unable to source one and have it installed before the end of the day.

This incident is classified as a network fault, it was beyond MainPower's control. At the point when the generators and transformer failed, we had already commenced the critical work. On its failure and the understanding that it could not be readily fixed by the subcontractor, we decided to cease the remaining planned maintenance and focussed our team on finishing to allow us to reconnect Hanmer Springs as quickly as possible.

MainPower is in the process of addressing this with the subcontractor in relation to the issues experienced and is investigating what caused this failure. We are incredibly disappointed by this situation and that our customers feel let down by MainPower and our subcontractor.

It is necessary for MainPower to complete network maintenance on the network as required to maintain reliability and safety. While we cannot guarantee electricity is supplied 100% of the time, we try to minimise the impact on our customers where possible. Unfortunately, even with appropriate plans in place for this work, we failed to achieve this and for that we apologise.


20 August - World Mosquito Day

1. 11.47 am. After 15 minutes wait — First contact with Spark in which I explain that we have a problem with sending the Email Pinkie, it's getting labelled as spam.
2. 12.03 pm Transferred to Xtra mail, spend 06 minutes verifying who I am and giving account no. and explaining problem
3. 12.22 pm Transfer to someone else in Xtra Mail (in Manilla). Here we repeat Step 2.
4. 12.49 pm Transfer to someone else (still in Manilla) Repeat steps 2 and 3 then nine minutes of martial music
5. 1.01pm Transfer to technical staff (still in Manilla - still the same person)
6. 1.17pm This step is called 'reiteration' in which we explain that half the time when we go to mail the Pinkie out, Xtra mail decides it won't send it because it is Spam. When it does allow me to send it out, Xtra addresses don't get it because it is rejected as Spam

Slow-baked lamb shoulder with garam masala

This method of cooking lamb is divine, producing full-flavoured, unctuous meat that takes on the fragrant spices. Serve simply with spiced potatoes or lentils and a little rice.

Ingredients

5 cloves garlic, finely grated
12cm piece ginger, finely grated
2 tbsp salt flakes, plus extra
1 lemon, zest and juice
3 tbsp garam masala
5 tbsp plain yoghurt
About 2.5kg whole lamb shoulder, bone in
80ml extra virgin olive oil
3 brown onions, sliced in rings

To serve

1 bunch coriander, picked
4 limes
500ml yoghurt, hung in a cheesecloth to drain and thicken

Method

1. Combine the garlic, ginger, salt, lemon juice and zest, garam masala and yoghurt.
2. Make incisions all over both sides of the lamb with a sharp knife and massage the yoghurt mix over it. Cover and marinate in the fridge overnight.
3. The next day, remove the shoulder from the fridge and place in a baking dish with the fat-side up. Allow to sit at room temperature for an hour. Preheat the oven to 150C fan-forced or 170C conventional.
4. While the lamb sits, in a large frying pan over medium heat add the oil and fry the onions until golden brown. Season. Set half aside for garnish, scatter the rest over the lamb.
5. Add 450ml of water to the baking tray, cover the whole tray tightly with baking paper and foil and cook for four hours.
6. Check the lamb - it should be meltingly tender. Remove the foil and paper, sprinkle over the remaining onions and cook for a further 30 minutes at 170C to brown and crisp up.
7. Strain off the juices in the tray, skim off any fat and serve with the meat. Garnish with coriander leaves and lime wedges, with the drained yoghurt on the side.

Simple Fish Curry

Ingredients

4 tbsp vegetable oil
2 tsp cumin seeds
2 onions, thinly sliced
6 fresh curry leaves, optional
1 tsp turmeric
1 tsp ground coriander
1/2 tsp chilli powder
4 tomatoes, finely chopped
1 1/2 cups water
1kg firm flesh fish fillet, cut into 3cm pieces
2 tbsp chopped fresh coriander leaves
Lemon wedges to serve

Method

Heat two tablespoons oil over high heat, add cumin seeds and cook until they pop. Reduce heat to medium, add onion and cook for five minutes until onions are softened and slightly caramelised. Add remaining spices and cook for one minute, then add tomatoes and cook for a few minutes until they soften and start to break up. Add water and stir to combine. Continue cooking to thicken sauce. Heat remaining oil in a separate pan and cook fish for two minutes each side, then add to curry sauce. Cook over low heat until fish is just cooked through. Sprinkle over coriander leaves and serve with lemon wedges.




