Roast Chicken on Baked, Spiced Rice

Ingredients

50g fine salt
1.2–1.4kg free-range chicken
1½ cups basmati rice
150g salted butter
1 large white onion, sliced into half-moons
5 garlic cloves, finely sliced
1 tbsp cumin seeds
salt flakes
freshly ground black pepper
3 cups chicken stock
12 cherry tomatoes
3 fresh bay leaves
½ lemon

Method

1. Combine the salt with 1.2-1.5 litres of cold water until the salt dissolves, and submerge the chicken in it. Stand at room temperature for 2 hours, then remove the bird, drain and dry with paper towel.
2. Preheat the oven to 200C fan-forced (220C conventional). Place the rice in a deep-sided enamel baking tray or ovenproof ceramic dish about 20cm x 30cm.
3. Melt the butter in a large frying pan over a medium heat. Add the chicken, breast-side down, and sear for about 5 minutes to brown, then rotate the bird to sear it on all sides.
4. Add the onion, garlic and cumin to the pan and cook until softened and lightly coloured, about 6 minutes. Don't allow the pan to get too hot – you don't want to burn the butter.
5. Once the onion and garlic are a little golden, position the bird in the rice, breast-side up. Season the onion generously with salt and pepper, then spread out on top of the rice, spooning any remaining butter over the chicken. Season the bird well with pepper.
6. Return the pan to the heat and add the stock. Bring to a simmer and swirl to deglaze, then pour over the rice and add the cherry tomatoes. Push two bay leaves into the rice and stuff the third into the cavity of the chicken. Squeeze the lemon's juice into the rice, then add the squeezed lemon to the cavity. Cover with baking paper, then foil, and roast for 40 minutes. Uncover and bake for a further 25 minutes, until golden.
7. Rest the chicken for 5-10 minutes before carving it in the dish so that the rice catches all the chicken juices. Serve with a leafy salad and either yoghurt flavoured with mint and garlic, or your favourite spicy sauce.

Chicken and Sausage Cassoulet

Cassoulet is one of my favourite dishes. This simple home-style version is closer to baked beans and sausages than fine French fare, but I'm okay with that. If using dried beans you'll need to start soaking them the night before.

Ingredients

400g dried great northern beans, cannellini beans or navy beans
2 tbsp olive oil
4 chicken drumsticks
4 good-quality pork sausages
4 thick slices speck or 200g bacon pieces
1 onion, peeled and diced
1 small carrot, peeled and diced
1 stick celery, diced
1 cup tomato passata
2 cups chicken stock
2 bay leaves
5 sprigs thyme
1 tsp salt
2 tbsp chopped parsley, to serve

Method

1. Place the beans in a bowl, cover them with water – about 3 centimetres above the beans – and add a teaspoon of salt. Allow to stand at room temperature overnight. Drain the beans and rinse with clean water, then place in a medium saucepan and cover with water again. Bring to a simmer and simmer for 40 minutes then drain.
2. Heat your oven to 150C fan-forced (160C conventional). Heat a large, wide, oven-proof frying pan (or use a heavy baking dish) over medium heat. Add the oil and fry the chicken drumsticks, sausages and speck or bacon until browned. Remove from the pan (if using bacon pieces you can leave these in the pan). Add the onion, carrot and celery and fry for about 10 minutes until fragrant. Add the beans to the pan and stir to coat and combine. Add the passata, chicken stock, bay leaves, thyme and salt and stir.
3. Arrange the chicken, sausages, and speck back in the pan, pressing them into the mixture until halfway submerged. Bake for 90 minutes, then remove from the oven and allow to stand for 10 minutes. Scatter with parsley and serve.

Tip: I prefer to use dried beans as I think they have a better flavour and soaking overnight takes no effort at all, but if you're pressed for time then use canned and skip the soaking.

More Attractions for Hanmer Heritage Forest

A popular area of the Hanmer Heritage Forest has undergone a renaissance with the arrival of another sculpture and replanting of a recently-cleared area.

The sculpture is a tuatara created by Andrew Lyons, of Christchurch, many of whose works already feature around the Forest Amble.

Trust chairperson Pauline Bennett said the tuatara was a great asset to add to the already-popular redwood sculptures.

“It’s also great to see people out in the forest and enjoying it. Thanks also to Ngai Tahu and Rayonier for allowing us access into the forest. It’s such a great attraction for Hanmer Springs.”

A few metres away from the tuatara, staff from Rayonier and Gavins Logging recently planted about 800 Coastal Redwoods in the area cleared of Larch trees for safety reasons.

General manager operations for Rayonier Matariki Forests, Darren Mann, said it was great to see so many people enjoying the tuatara and the covenant tracks.

The companies undertook the planting project as a team-building exercise and then enjoyed a barbecue with trust board members.

A new track has been formed through the cleared area and a sign explaining what has happened will be erected shortly.

Nine sculptures have been erected around the amble so far and more are planned.







Mary Holloway West Ward Councillor writes:

I attended my first Council meeting last week- was sworn in- eyes and ears wide open! The Mayor, other Councillors and Council staff, I must say, were all very welcoming.

We discussed the 3 waters reform – Central Government Proposal and funding package.

The Govt offered a Post Covid \$761 million dollar package to local Councils to maintain and improve their three waters infra structure- (drinking, waste and storm water). In order to receive the funding, though, the Council must enter into an MoU with the Government to explore the probable re-structure of water-delivery (post the Havelock North incident) that is proposed to improve the 3 waters infrastructure nation wide. Carrot and stick.

The Fly-ride project construction phase on Conical Hill will be managed by the Hanmer Springs Thermal Pools and Spa who have demonstrated the ability to deliver development projects on time and on budget.

The treated water disposal land block issue has been covered by Shane Adcock (acting Community Board Chair) also in this publication. It is sad that we can't change the course of this project at this very late stage, but I think that the take home message from this is that the relevant information has been in the public realm for a long time apparently. Democracy starts with us as individuals. It only takes a few minutes once a month to read through Council or Community Board agendas on the HDC website. Get involved, have your say at the time!

Hanmer Springs Community Board Update

The Hanmer Springs Community Board met on 24 August.

Pause on future decision of Hurunui Waiau Uwha Zone Committee

The hard work of the Hurunui Waiau Uwha Zone Committee (HWZC) over the past decade, (including its past and current members and staff) was acknowledged at last week's Hurunui District Council Extraordinary Meeting.

A motion was passed that Officers will come back with a paper delivering options going forward, with regard to the future role of the HWZC.

There has also been unanimous Councillor agreement to suspend the planned September refresh of the HWZC.

Mayor Marie Black supported the suspension, adding that Councillor Lynda Murchison's suggestion "it's time to take a pause" was very valid.

"We need compatibility, we need to co-design something for the future."

The review of the HWZC responds to a direct request by the HWZC, supported by HDC and Environment Canterbury (ECan).

As part of the recent Fit for Future project (populating the Canterbury Water Management Strategy (CWMS) with 2025-2030 targets) the Mayoral Forum reaffirmed their support for zone committees, and then asked ECan to lead further advice on how to help zone committees focus more on implementation.

Mayor Black said the Council report stated that developing strong well-connected zone committees that are focussed on implementation through facilitating local action on the ground, is the purpose of any potential change.

"Identifying how zone committees can transition from a focus on planning, to collaboration, is paramount in this process going forward."

Below is a summary of the key decisions and discussions from the meeting.

At the meeting, the board:

Recommended to Hurunui District Council (HDC) to sign the agreement with the Amuri Community Arts Council, extending the provision of the gallery space in the library to the Arts Council for exhibitions.

Received and discussed correspondence from residents regarding the planting of pines on the land that will be used for the discharge of treated sewerage. The board agrees it would be fantastic to plant natives but understands the Council's concerns in doing so and so ultimately agrees with the Council's planting plan.

Received the resignation of board member Graham Frith. We are all extremely sorry to see Graham (Grum) leave the board. A by-election for both Mary Holloway's (due to Mary being elected as Councillor) and Graham Frith's vacancies will be held soon.

Discussed the recent power outage and decided to work with the Business Association in raising the issues with Mainpower.

Met with representatives from the Track Network Group and discussed the possibility of creating a trail hub with maps and information on the village green.


