Crispy-skinned barbecue salmon with Chilean pebre

This fresh Chilean salsa is all you need to turn a few salmon fillets into a show-stopping barbecue dish. And if you haven't fired up the barbie, it's great in a frying pan, too.

Ingredients

- 4 salmon fillets (about 150g each), scaled and pin-boned
- 1 tbsp vegetable oil
- 1 tsp salt

Pebre

- 1 medium onion, peeled and finely chopped
- 4 thin spring onions, finely sliced
- ½ a yellow capsicum, deseeded and finely chopped
- 3 tomatoes, finely chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 1 large green chilli, deseeded and finely chopped
- 1 large red chilli, deseeded and finely chopped
- ½ cup roughly chopped coriander
- ¼ cup red wine vinegar
- 1 tsp sugar
- ¼ tsp salt
- ¼ cup grapeseed oil

Method

1. For the pebre, mix the ingredients together and allow to stand at room temperature for
2. Cut a few lines through the skin along the length of the salmon, but don't cut into the meat. You don't have to do this, but it can help with getting a crisp skin. Pat the salmon dry with paper towel.
3. Heat the hotplate of a barbecue or a heavy frying pan over high heat and brush the skin of the salmon with a little oil.
4. Season the skin side of the salmon with salt and place the salmon on the barbecue skin-side down. Press with a spatula on the back of the first 20 seconds of cooking to keep the skin against the hotplate. Cook for about three minutes on the first side until the skin is browned and crisp.
5. Season the flesh side of the fish, turn and cook for a further three minutes until just cooked through. Serve with the pebre.

Quick barbecued pork belly with spiced vinegar

Ask any Filipino or Filipina about "liempo" and you'll get an almost primal reaction. It's one of the country's favourite comfort foods, and with good reason. I like to leave the slightly chewy skin on the pork belly but you can remove it if you prefer.

Ingredients

- 1kg pork belly, cut into 1cm strips
- ½ cup light soy sauce
- ¼ cup lime juice
- ¼ cup white vinegar
- ¼ cup brown sugar
- 6 cloves garlic, finely minced
- ½ tsp ground black pepper
- ½ cup water
- ¼ cup tomato sauce (or ketchup) - check gluten-free if required
- ¼ cup vegetable oil

For the spiced vinegar

- ¼ cup white vinegar
- 2 tbsp lime juice
- ½ small red onion, finely minced
- 2 cloves garlic, finely minced
- 2 bird's eye chillies, finely sliced
- ¼ tsp salt
- ½ tsp light soy sauce
- ½ tsp sugar

Method

1. Place the pork belly strips in a large press-seal bag and add the soy sauce, lime juice, vinegar, brown sugar, garlic, pepper, and ½ cup of water. Mix well and refrigerate overnight.
2. Remove the pork belly from the bag and transfer the reserved marinade to a small saucepan. Bring to the boil and boil for a further one minute, then remove from the heat and mix in the tomato sauce and vegetable oil.
3. **For the spiced vinegar**, combine all the ingredients in a non-reactive bowl or jar and mix well to dissolve the salt and sugar. Allow to stand for at least 15 minutes before serving.
4. Heat a barbecue grill or frying pan over medium heat and grill the pork belly for about five minutes, flipping occasionally. Baste with the reserved marinade mixture and grill for a further five minutes until darkly caramelised. Serve with the spiced vinegar and fried rice.

The barbecue pork sausage roll from Pj's Pies in Hanmer Springs has been awarded eighth place in the Legendary Sausage Roll Competition. On Thursday, the nod was incorrectly given to Christchurch's Burwood Bakery.

PJ's Pies co-owner James Bratschie told Stuff he was shocked to hear of the mistake, but very excited by the outcome.

"I see the glass half full ... It's a good surprise."

The Pinkie spoke to Jim at the market on Saturday where he was selling his equally famous sour dough bread. We enquired after a sausage roll but were directed to the Four Square where the pie-warmer was chocker with said rolls. They were obviously expecting a rush.

In the Pink



Tombstone Mountain Bike Race

The day following the Hanmer Holiday Homes Alpine Marathon an exciting new event has been added to the calendar by the addition of The Tombstone Mountain Bike Race a cross-country mountain bike challenge for all abilities and takes competitors on a stunning journey through Hanmer Forest.

Pools Hours Will Extend in December

The Pools complex will extend its hours on December 19th at which time they will be opening in the evenings with hours from 10 am to 9pm as they did before the pandemic. We have had several enquiries on the subject so we confirmed this with Graeme Abbot. Graeme did say that they would be going back to shorted hours (closing at 6 pm) again next winter. The pools have enjoyed a 15% growth in business since lockdown and in the recent school holiday business was up by 19%.

Graeme also told us that the complex will have a generator installed before Christmas.

Fly Ride

Things are moving along apace for this new attraction.

There is a tight deadline for this to be complete before the end of October 2021. Work on getting the ride up and running is being overseen by the Thermal Pools and Spa.

The ride will be coming down the west side of Conical Hill and is on Council Reserve land. Consents will be lodged within six weeks and the complex is now looking at

proposals and they are hoping they can find a New Zealand contractor to do the work.

A public meeting on the subject will be announced soon.



Mr. A. R. Barclay invites the electors of Dunedin to meet him on Friday next at the Drillshed, North Dunedin, and on Monday at the Wesleyan Hall, Woodhaugh. A monster meeting is to be held on Tuesday evening at the Garrison Hall.—* * *

The hotel is still in charge of Mr. and Mrs. Ross, and Mr. Clarke will act as guide up to the end of February. The huts have been provisioned to meet the wants of tourists and climbers. For invalids afflicted with rheumatism, skin diseases, etc., the baths at the Hanmer Springs are ample, and the sanatorium has accommodation for visitors. A new building for board and lodging at lower rates will be ready about the beginning of the year. There are other houses where ample accommodation and excellent rooms may also be obtained.—* * *

April 1916

Another Convalescent Home is now nearing completion at Hanmer. It is built on the same principle as the one opened in January at Rotorua, and will probably be ready for occupation in May. The Lodge at Hanmer has done a useful work, pending the erection of the permanent Home.


